






Figure 1. On-Region Characteristics 25°C




Figure 3. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 5. Body Diode Forward Voltage Variation vs. Source Current and Temperature




Figure 2. On-Region Characteristics 150°C




Figure 4. On-Resistance Variation vs. Drain **Current and Gate Voltage** 




Figure 6. Capacitance Characteristics





Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics

T<sub>J</sub>, JUNCTION TEMPERATURE (°C)







Figure 9. On-Resistance Variation vs. Temperature

Figure 10. Maximum Safe Operating Area






Figure 11. Maximum Drain Current vs. Case Temperature




Figure 13. Normalized Power Dissipation vs. Case Temperature




Figure 14. Peak Current Capability




Figure 15. R<sub>DS(on)</sub> vs. Gate Voltage




Figure 16. Normalized Gate Threshold Voltage vs. Temperature




Figure 17. Transient Thermal Response
